Wayne Phillips – International Cricketer

South Australia's Wayne Phillips was a rakishly built left handed batsman and wicketkeeper who represented both state and country over the course of a first class career between the 1977 and 1991. Phillips enjoyed a meteoric rise to the top flight, after a century on debut. He was transformed into an opener and then asked to become a wicketkeeper on the basis of his experience as a gloveman at underage. Ultimately, Phillips became involved in full-time coaching work at the Australian Cricket Academy in Adelaide, a role in which he still functions today. He can also occasionally be heard as a television commentator on the Nine Network.
